Nelly Wilmot's Testimony

Nelly's journey of faith began as a young girl. In school, she had Biblical studies and grew up in a family that had a syncretistic approach to the Christian faith. They mixed Christianity with animistic, spiritual and ancestral practices that are native to her home country of South Africa. She doesn't know when she asked Jesus into her life. It was only later in life that she realized the difference between knowing about God and having a personal relationship with Him.

As an adult, she continued to involve herself in Christian communities. However, life as she knew it came to a halt when her marriage gradually took a turn and became abusive. She and her children sought refuge at a shelter and lived on food stamps which was completely different from the life they lived with her husband. It was in the shelter that she found her faith. She was invited to a Sunday Bible study hosted by women from East Harlem Fellowship at the shelter. She battled with the thought that she probably knew what was being taught but she decided to give it a try. These studies gave her the opportunity to ask the questions that were on her heart about the Bible, God and her personal situation. One teacher discipled her and was there for her. One day after a lesson, they asked if someone wanted to give their life to Christ. Nelly stood up to rededicate her life to Him! Shortly thereafter, she attended a food drive at East Harlem Fellowship and each Sunday after that she was at every service and outreach! She was baptized in June 2014.

Over time, God did a deep work in Nelly. He delivered her from the PTSD associated with the abuse she experienced. He freed her from unforgiveness and healed her emotional and spiritual wounds. God has given her peace and assurance that He is her protection. His loving hand has also worked on her children. They are happy and well adjusted in school.

Today Nelly pours into the lives of others. Some friends think she is “too spiritual” while others view her walk with Jesus as inspirational. When problems arise, Nelly seeks God and He answers! The joy, peace and security God has given, informs her outlook on life. Nelly says, “As long as I have breath to breathe I will praise You, Lord!”

This was one many instances we saw the hand of God guide and protect us throughout the whole trip.

The lessons and blessings God had in store ahead are too many to tell. We saw the church in Cuba as a beautiful example that in Christ you can be truly free even in a country with an oppressive government. Only the Holy Spirit can make this possible. We also saw the local church, that although poor, was rich in joy, peace, and passion to serve and live life with each other. They shared all they had which reminded us of the church in the book of Acts. At the end, these precious brothers and sisters so were grateful beyond description, but we felt that we had been blessed even more! The Lord has proven that when we step out in faith and obedience with our two fish and five loaves, He is faithful to multiply and give the increase.
